Dear Senator Feinstein,

As Co-Chair of the California Legislative Delta Caucus and representative of Assembly District 11, California's Delta District, I urge you to end your support for the WIIN Act extensions currently under consideration in Congress. The WIIN Act was meant to be an emergency measure to assist Californians across the state during a time of historically severe drought. Extending short-term provisions of the act until 2028 without substantial engagement from Delta residents represents concerning federal overreach and overrides the "careful balance" which former President Barack Obama spoke of when signing the act into law.

The Bay-Delta ecosystem relies on evenhanded stewardship to succeed for every user. You are sending a clear message of support for billionaire agribusiness and contractors at the expense of local fishermen, farmers, and families. Rather than conduct the people's business on Governor Brown's timeline, I urge you to reconsider the proposed actions in future legislative sessions while seeking substantial input from the Delta community. The current proposed extension of the WIIN Act signals unwelcome support for Governor Brown's destructive tunnels proposal. Harming one part of California's economy to benefit another is the wrong decision for the state and for our shared constituents – we must support our local ecosystem and Delta economy.

I urge you to drop your support for these misguided and harmful extensions to the WIIN Act. I ask that you stand up for the California Delta, and the millions of Californians who believe that small businesses and the Bay-Delta's precious environment should have a fair chance to thrive.
